

Tanker ship - Vetting Inspections

Course aim and objectives:

This course provides participants with the required knowledge for understanding the criteria of vetting inspections and the criteria of the vetting process combined with TMSA assessments for tanker ship operators. The course explains the strategies for managing the preparation of crew and vessel to pass a successful on-board physical inspection by major oil companies and avoid high risk observations for non-compliance to minimum safety criteria which can eventually have an impact on the vessel's commercial and trading prospects.

Course main elements:

- Background and introduction to tanker vetting inspections
- Vetting objectives and SIRE program
- Minimum safety criteria of major oil companies
- Preparation and management of the on-board inspection
- Observation categories, review and corrective actions
- Overview of TMSA elements
- Practical exercises and final examination

Course participation:

The course is open to shipping company top management, operations, technical, commercial, quality and safety managers, superintendents, internal auditing team, masters and ship officers involved in the on-board vetting inspection process

Course duration: 2 days

This training program is currently provided in 12-hours with real time instruction through a dedicated e-platform in 3 four-hour pre-scheduled interactive web-based learning sessions.
